Just a reminder about the staffing changes after Easter.

Two new teachers have been appointed; Mrs Harrison-Reilly will be teaching Year 1 and Miss Corcoran will be teaching Year 4. Both have a wealth of teaching experience and we were very impressed at interview. Both have now attended a full induction so will be up to speed and raring to go when we return after Easter. We are looking forward to welcoming them to our team.

Miss Manuel will be starting in her new role as Director for Primary Inclusion and Culture for the Trust – this is a 2 day role so she will still be in school for 2 days per week, although she will not have a class on those 2 days as she will be providing PPA cover and concentrating on her SEN role.

Mrs Woodfield is being seconded to Linthwaite J, I & Early Years for the summer term, to support them in the absence of a Headteacher and ensure they are fully prepared for their transition to the Together Learning Trust later this year. She will still be overseeing Meltham Moor and will always be at hand should we need her. Mrs Marshall, who is currently out of class two days per week while Mrs Woodfield has been undertaking her Trust role, will be out of class all the time after Easter in her Acting Headteacher role. This will ensure that there is always a Headteacher available.

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Year 2 & Year 6 Easter Visit to Christchurch, Helme


